California Cities for Local Control, a growing coalition comprising to-date of <u>over 427</u> <u>locally-elected California City Mayors and Councilmembers</u>, strongly opposes AB 678 (see website referenced below for list of elected officials).

AB 678 sets a limit on fees that a city could apply to housing developments, specifically a cap of 12 percent of the city or county's median home price, as determined by the California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD). HCD could approve exceptions under yet-to-be-determined standards.

The bill imposes extensive, additional requirements on cities, including the development of a "nexus study" to demonstrate compliance with the bill's provisions, with a city's fees subject to protest procedures. The bill further stipulates court proceedings and monetary penalties for noncompliance.

The Legislature should work cooperatively with city governments to address the state's housing needs.
